PERFORMANCE

Carmena Z was produced by Seamus Hayes as a youngster in Ireland, qualifying for all of the major young horse championships including Millstreet, Cavan, Dublin & Lanaken. Shane Breen took over the ride in 2007 when they had several good placings on the continent (Modena & Cervia) and won the 6 & 7 Year Old Final at Bourg En Bresse CSI4*. In Ireland, they were narrowly beaten into second place in the Liscagot Seven Year Old Championship in Dublin, but they took three classes at the Hickstead CSI5* in July, including the Old Lodge Young Breeding Horse Championship.

In 2008, he carried Shane to overall 4th at the British Open, Birmingham. He won the Old Lodge Young Breeding Horse Championship for the second year running, and helped Shane make history as the first man to win the Queen Elizabeth II Cup at the Royal International Horse Show.



SHANE ON CARMENA

“With a stallion it is important that he’s seen winning at a higher level and at top-class venues. With the thoroughbred influence through his dam’s sire, he’s got plenty of speed. He has not been used for breeding yet. We are very excited at the prospect of being able to use him this season. Not only is his breeding impeccable, but he has the talent and the will to go with it. The biggest test of his career so far was the Old Lodge Queen’s Cup last year at Hickstead—he showed that he has the will to win on the big occasions. It is rare to get such a combination of heart and talent in one horse. I know that this horse is going to be one of the best that Ireland has ever produced”.
